The VMSA has partnered with many organisations to present some great events for shedders statewide.



Stephen has contributed strongly to the Flowerdale community for the past five years. He involves himself passionately and actively looks for ways to support and promote members of the community groups in which he is involved. He is primarily a team player, but not afraid of taking the lead where necessary and creating change where needed.

Some of Stephen's many contributions to the community include: campaigning for new Committee members for the Flowerdale Community House; serving on the Executive Committee of the Flowerdale Landcare Inc. which has also involved convening a committee to organise ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day observances (the first time that ANZAC Day has been observed for at least 45 years); serving as Secretary on the Executive Committee of the Flowerdale Men's Shed and establishing the Flowerdale Men's Shed family violence initiative.

Stephen also established the Murrindindi Men's Shed Cluster which includes participants from the Alexandra, Flowerdale, Kinglake, Marysville, Toolangi and Whittlesea Men's Sheds, and in 2014 he helped organise convoys to take hay to fire-affected locations in the Mickleham and Kilmore areas.

Stephen has also been successful in attracting many grants for the Flowerdale Men's Shed and has also served as an active participant of Strath Creek Landcare since 1998.



VMSA State-Wide Gathering in Warrnambool Friday March 27th




The VMSA is taking its state-wide Gathering to regional Victoria in keeping with our commitment to staying in touch with our grassroots membership.


VMSA Queen Victoria Market Men's Shed Expo

Community Services & Volunteers Grants

Sunsuper Dreams program

Sunsuper Dreams is all about doing something positive for the community in a really meaningful way. Dreams must make a positive community impact to qualify. This initiative gives individuals, groups and organisations the opportunity to be awarded a \$5,000 grant to help realise a dream for a better world. The focus varies each round and includes health & people, sport & community, environment & animals. There is an open focus for the January 2015 round.

Applications close 31 January 2015.

Bennelong Foundation

The Bennelong Foundation supports organisations and projects with a focus on the areas of Education, Training & Employment, Migrant & Indigenous Community Welfare and Community Health. Only groups with DGR Status can apply.

Applications close 13 February 2015.

Besen Family Foundation Grants

The Besen Family Foundation has three priority areas for grant making: Arts & Culture; Health & Welfare and Jewish Interests. Grants are made to support the immediate and long-term needs of the wider community in Victoria and in Israel. The Foundation's grant making goals are to assist these communities to build capacity and community connectedness and to affect long-term change towards a better quality of life. Grants are also made to assist innovative and creative arts projects that challenge the current boundaries of their given discipline.

Only groups with DGR and TCC Status can apply.

James N Kirby Foundation

The James N Kirby Foundation supports organisations that provide innovative solutions and opportunities to those in the community who need it most. The supports organisations and programs whose work benefits education and technology; the environment; health, social welfare and the arts. Only groups with DGR Status can apply.

Applications close 28 February 2015.

Helen Macpherson Smith Trust Grants

The Helen Macpherson Smith Trust Grants support the needs of the wider community of Victoria across a range of targeted program areas. Grants are available in Education and Vocational Pathways, Regional Resilience, Culture and Heritage, Land and Environmental Stewardship and Health Advancement across two grant streams. Only groups with TCC Status can apply.

Applications close 26 March 2015.

Carlisle Homes Community Grants

The Carlisle Homes Community Grants support projects that add value to the community in the areas of sport and recreation, health and caring, education and training. Shortlisted projects are judged by number of likes on Facebook and/or promoters webpage.

Applications close 31 March 2015.

Coopers Brewery Foundation

The Coopers Brewery Foundation supports medical research and health care, educational development for the young, aged care or promotion of family and community support based on Christian values. Only groups with DGR Status can apply.

Applications close 31 March 2015.

Grants for Resilience & Wellness

The Grants for Resilience & Wellness program has a specific focus on providing assistance towards community-strengthening and resilience-building projects for communities affected by the 2009 Victorian bushfires. It recognises that while the fires were in 2009, recovery takes time and an important part of community recovery is having opportunities to connect, share experiences, enhance individual and community wellbeing and resilience, and to build strength and capacity for the future.

Plan for hot weather don't get caught out this summer. Take a minute right now to think about how you can stay healthy in the heat. To prepare for hot weather you can: Ask yourself if you or someone in your family, neighbourhood or circle of friends are vulnerable to heat-related illness and how you might care for them in extreme heat.

☐ Think of ways you can prepare your home, for example, checking your cooling appliances are working.
 Have a list in mind of places you could go to escape the heat, if it's just not possible to stay cool at home, and get there before the heat really hits. Remember that power failures can happen in extreme heat. Think about what you will do to stay
cool and keep in touch. What actions to take during hot weather during extreme heat, whether it's one hot day or a
heatwave, remember:
 □ Look after yourself and keep in touch with others. □ Drink plenty of water. □ Keep cool. □ Stay out of the sun.
 ☐ Hot cars kill – do not leave anyone in a car who cannot easily and quickly get out by themselves. ☐ For any health concerns contact your doctor, call NURSE-ON-CALL on 1300 60 60 24

□ Contact a medical professional or ambulance in the case of an emergency.
