### **Chairman's Report**

#### Dear Members,

I'm pleased to have the opportunity to provide my first report as Chair of the AMSA Board of Management. By way of introduction, I have been involved with the Men's Shed Movement since 2001 when I was a founding member of the Mansfield Men's Shed in North East Victoria. As one of the early Sheds we were active in assisting communities around the country to establish new Sheds, informing the Victorian government in the establishment of the first Men's Shed Program as well as being involved in the formation of both the Australian and Victorian Men's Shed Associations.

At the 2009 National Conference in Hobart (perhaps after a few too many refreshments), I was "persuaded" to join the Committee of the VMSA. As a result, I served six years on the VMSA Committee, the last four of these as President. These early years were exciting and rewarding to be part of as the Men's Shed movement gained momentum locally, nationally and internationally with both communities and governments. The success, I believe, was that community-based Men's Sheds openly and freely shared their knowledge and experience with others to promote the benefits of the Men's Shed movement.

Over the past year or so there has been some discussion and confusion surrounding AMSA and State Associations. However, the message I hear as I travel around is that most Sheds aren't interested in this issue and that they prefer one national body. Nevertheless, it's important that we 're all united in furthering the wellbeing and health of our members, and men in general. My opinion as a taxpayer is that both the federal and state governments have a role to play - we all pay, in one way or another, both state and federal taxes. Therefore, I believe that there is a role for State bodies to lobby their respective State governments and encourage them to financially support Sheds in their State. However, as a taxpayer I do not like to see my taxes spent on duplication and competitive actions. To this end I have written to all State bodies requesting a meeting to discuss how we can work towards a mutually beneficial and harmonious relationship.

Since becoming Chair, I've had both the opportunity and pleasure to attend several

Shed events around the country. Some highlights have been a sod turning for a proposed Shed at Violet Town, the opening of new Shed at Tallygaroopna and a Shed Gathering in Hervey Bay. The Hervey Bay event was particularly memorable as I met two men who clearly reminded me of the value of Sheds – one who had recently lost his wife and was at risk of harm and the other a young shy and unemployed man who had gained both social and trade skills.

I've been impressed with the response from the Men's Shed movement to the current drought crisis gripping Australia, particularly in NSW and QLD. My thanks go to those many Sheds who have come up with innovative ways to not only raise much needed funds to donate to this situation, but also to those Sheds who have adopted a human touch. As the saying goes "a hand up is better than a handout", and many Sheds have taken time to travel to drought affected areas to deliver personal needs and to talk 'shoulder to shoulder' in the spirit of mateship.

Speaking of mateship, "Mateship" is the theme of 'Men's Shed Week' which we launched at Menshed Wagga Wagga. Mateship is an underpinning value of Men's Sheds and it is important to recognise the friendships that are built in Men's Sheds every day and to remind ourselves that this is what it's all about. The launch was very successful with around 150 people turning up and it was great to see so many Sheds from both NSW and VIC in attendance. Thanks to the Wagga Wagga Shed community for hosting the event and being so welcoming.

Also, the AMSA Annual General Meeting will be held on 11 October in Newcastle and again I encourage all AMSA member Men's Sheds to attend. If you are unable to attend in person or via electronic means, please complete the Proxy Form which has been posted with the AGM notification to all AMSA member Sheds.

Lastly, I wish to pay tribute to the AMSA staff. They are passionate about the Men's Shed movement, are dedicated to serving you and often deliver more than they are asked.

### **Mateship at Eudunda Community Shed**

What does mateship mean at the Eudunda Community Shed?

Our Hub/Shed is not gender-specific. We have men and women, and even a kid, turn up every Tuesday morning.

Some are couples, others are independents.

Some are elderly, others are disabled. Some are alone, and for them visiting the shed is an outing to meet and talk with other people.

Some of us are very skilled at certain things, some of us are competent at a number of things and some of us haven't a clue about anything much but want to know a bit more.

Some of the blokes know how to make a milking stand for a goat so they're teaching the kid who owns the goat how to use the saw and the drill and to recycle second-hand timber so that she can make her own milking stand.

Some of the women do mosaic tiling so the first thing they wanted to do is a splash back for the kitchen sink.

The blokes measured up the panels and worked out a way to fix them to the walls and then cleared a space in the shed for everyone to work together on the tiling. For a while, it was just women tiling. They worked away, chatting and laughing, nibbling and cutting tiles and enjoying themselves. Slowly though, some of the blokes would wander past and stop, out of curiousity or to wonder why the women would be laughing so loudly. Gradually, these men started to cut some tiles too and to glue them to the panels they had cut.

Ultimately, men and women would gather at the bench and tile away until the project was finished.

A woman bought an old chopping board in to be restored. One of the blokes spent a lot of time on it and brought it back beautifully. The woman was so pleased, she knitted beanies for the next market day.

Another woman had been making her own soap for years so she taught some of the others how to do it. They made soap to sell at the monthly market and some of the blokes helped to set the tables up and paint the signs.

One of the local auctioneers offered us an opportunity to put on a sausage sizzle at a clearing sale. Women cooked the sausages, men served at the table, men cooked, women served and we all had a fun day together and made a few dollars for the kitty as well.

We think our Hub/Shed epitomizes mateship, where men and women can gather together, work together, help each other out and most of all, enjoy each others' company.

The best thing about the mateship at our Hub/Shed is that every Tuesday, we all sit down at a big table and enjoy lunch together. Members take it in turns to provide lunch from a budget, everyone pays with a couple of gold coins and we sit down at a table and eat together.


Today, we had seventeen people enjoying home-made pasties and soup and this time last year, not one of those seventeen people knew all of the other sixteen.

## Generosity of Men's Sheds shines through as drought relief efforts mount

As the situation in drought-affected areas of Australia becomes more dire, the generosity of Men's Sheds continues to shine.

Men's Sheds from across Australia have continued to embrace the spirit of mateship in our network, with a great number of ideas and fundraising drives occurring around the country.

This latest update brings you a summary of recent shed activities and efforts.

We first got a call from a Shed member letting us know they were teaming up with a Shed in a rural area to run a community event and both Sheds were going to attend to help raise spirits in the town, they did not stop there they were sending hay for stock feed as well.

Then a call from another Shed saying they were going out to the heart of the drought to see the need first hand. Their report came in yesterday and painted a bleak picture of dusty paddocks and broken farmers. The Shed are now raising funds by every means possible to give to the Lions drought relief program much needed funds, particularly for fodder.

A Shed threw out a challenge for Sheds across Australia to raise \$1,000 each hoping to hit a \$1,000,000 target and then went and broke their own donation target by not only doubling down but then adding more- over \$2,500

Men's Sheds have pledged and given funds to CWA, Lions, Buy a Bale, Burrumbuttock Hayrunners, Blazeaid to name a few of the organisations on the ground helping our farmers and rural communities. A great idea for a day trip with friends whilst helping those in need.

Others are supporting others...we have just heard from a Shed that sponsored a runner in the City 2 Surf run that was raising funds for farmers across Australia to the tune of \$582.00, every dollar counts!



# Cockburn Community Men's Shed settles into home after six years in the making

After more than six years in the making, the Cockburn Community Men's Shed (WA) officially opened a new purposebuilt facility earlier this year.

Three men who couldn't be more pleased or proud were its inaugural 2013 chairman Mike Manning, current chairman Peter Hodgson and men's shed advocate and current treasurer Geoff Webb, who helped establish the project's vital partnership with the Rotary Club of Cockburn.

The City of Cockburn received resounding support for a local men's shed in response to a 2012 feasibility study, followed by a successful approach to the Rotary Club of Cockburn which agreed to partner in the project's establishment.

The shed's first home was in the old SES building in Wattleup and the plan to provide a permanent base will soon come to fruition, with the finishing touches underway at 2 Sullivan Road, Cockburn Central.

A former member of WA's oldest shed – Fremantle Men's Shed – Mr Manning (76) said he needed somewhere to use his creative skills that included wood and metal work.

"I retired at 70 and my wife said to me 'you are not going to sleep in that chair all day', and now she has to make an appointment to see me," the former designer and builder said.

"And I can be a good listener. It's great to have a safe space for men to come and talk about their issues."

Mr Hodgson (63), a long-standing Rotarian, became chairman in April 2017 and put his project and change management skills honed during his professional life to good use as the men's shed transitioned to its permanent home.

"I'd always intended to join a men's shed because although I don't have any artistic skills, I like pottering about with various projects," Mr Hodgson said.

"But what I really like about the objective is that men's sheds foster, maintain and promote men's physical and mental health and wellbeing.

"Often men don't want to be publicly talking about themselves and there is no pressure to lay on a couch and pour their heart out, here. But when they are ready to talk to another bloke in blokey language, a men's shed is a good place for that."

As a former Rotary Club of Bunbury member, Mr Webb (67) helped establish the Leschenault Men's Shed and was keen to use his experience to help Cockburn's come to fruition.

"It's been a huge effort to get the shed where it is today, and hats off to the City of Cockburn for all their support," Mr Webb said.

### Who can join these presentations?

#### What topics are covered?

Our online presentations cover topics such as common scams and how to spot them, how to shop and pay for things safely online, how to do everyday banking online, and how to connect safely via Facebook. We regularly review our material to ensure the content is up-to-date and new topics are released throughout the year.

### Who we are and what we hope to achieve
